PAPER #3 PROMPT

In a typed, double-spaced 4-6 page (1000-1500 word) essay, respond to the following prompt:

Write an essay that builds upon an analysis of how the law has regulated and disparaged the citizenship of racial and sexual minorities through historical bans on interracial marriage and same-sex marriage to speculate on the future of when (or if) LGBTQ people will be considered fully equal citizens of America.

You should consider, but not necessarily explicitly answer, the following questions:

- How is the citizenship of a minority group affected by limitations on whom they can marry?
- What are the ways in which marriage is/was used to delineate differences based on race, gender and sexuality?
- What is the relationship between public regulations and private intimacy?
- What are the ways the law currently derogates the rights of LGBTQ Americans?

WHAT THE PROMPT SAYS

"Write an essay that builds upon an analysis of how the law has regulated and disparaged the citizenship of racial and sexual minorities through historical bans on interracial marriage and same-sex marriage to speculate on the future of when (or if) LGBTQ people will be considered fully equal citizens of America." WHAT THE PROMPT MEANS

- CONTEXTUALIZE the legal history of inter-racial and same-sex marriage
- ANALYZE course readings which detail specific laws and regulations which directly target or impact racial and sexual minorities
- **SIGNIFY** the broader patterns, trends, and meanings which underly these bans and regulations
- SPECULATE how this impacts the future of the LGBTQ+ community within the legal sphere and at large

Pivotal to understanding and analyzing the connections between the Admissions Act and broader militarism in Hawai'i is the work of Kyle Kajihiro, a yonsei (fourth-generation Japanese in Hawai'i) scholar, whose contributions to the discourse Introduce of U.S. imperialism and strategic power highlight the broader environmental and social Author impacts of militarism felt today. In his words, militarism "cannot be reduced to a simple" product of military policy" but, instead, must be "understood as the result of a complex interaction of forces, including the political and economic fears and ambitions of global Direct powers...[and] the deployment of strategies to normalize and maintain militarism" Quotation (Kajihiro 170). Putting Kajihiro's framework in conversation with the language of the Admissions Act allows discourses of militarism in Hawai'i to expand and encompass its modern consequences. As the demographic of Hawai'i changes, coupling the histories of conquest with the dynamic housing crisis opens an entry point to examine Analysis the ways in which the normalized processes of militarization from statehood affect the socioeconomic autonomy of the people of Hawai'i and, most importantly, Native Hawaiians.
